### Don't Be Scammed!

SCAMMERS ARE GETTING MORE AND MORE CREATIVE. THEY PREY ON THOSE THAT BELIEVE THEM AND THEY INSTILL FEAR IN YOU UNTIL THEY GET WHAT THEY WANT!

We recently had one of our own members get scammed. She received an email claiming to be the 'fraud department' from her bank. The email said to click on a link and she did. She was instructed to withdraw money from the bank and deposit it in a Bitcoin machine here in town. She realizes this all sounds "dumb" and cannot believe she fell for it but they also preyed on her and made her fearful that something was really wrong at her bank. PLEASE, if you get an email or a phone call claiming to be from your bank, ignore the email and hang up the phone and contact your bank directly. A bank or credit card company would NEVER have you withdraw money and deposit it in a Bitcoin machine or ask you to buy gift cards, take a picture of them and send to someone. Again, these people are good and won't stop until they get what they want. Don't respond and come see us if you are unsure. Also, if you don't know a number calling you, don't answer it. Al can

record your voice and use it against you. Please be sure your voice mail is set up on your phone and your mailbox empty so that if it is a legitimate phone call, they can leave you a message. And one last thing, if you do get scammed, please tell someone! Telling someone is the BEST thing you can do!

### **FUEL ASSISTANCE RECERTIFICATION**

If you have received your recertification application, it is very important that you bring ALL the following paperwork to your appointment in order for the application to be complete:

- Recertification application (light blue) Identification
- •Proof of all income in your household
- •Copy of oil, gas, electric bill (source of heating)
- •A complete copy of your most recent electric bill.
  - Copy of water, sewer bill

We still have not received applications for **new** applicants.

Remember Fuel Assistance starts November 1, 2025 and ends April 30, 2026. There is still plenty of time to sign up and it is NOT first come, first served.
